

Terms and Conditions - Discovering Forgotten Writers Competition

Entry Information

You can choose whoever you like as your forgotten writer, as long as they were/are writing in the English language.

Your writer can be alive or dead, and be writing in any genre, form or style.

You must read and analyse at least one piece of their work, for example a novel, a play, or a collection of poetry, and explain what you thought about their work as part of your video.

You should create a video which is no longer than 10 minutes long. If your video is longer than this, we will ask you to edit this down before we consider it.

Your video should answer these questions and prompts:

- **Who is the person you have chosen?** Tell us about the time they were living and writing in
- **What works by this person did you read, and what did you think of what you read?** Tell us about at least one work they wrote, for example a novel, short story, a play, or a collection of poetry
- **How was their writing received at the time?**
- **Why did you choose this person and their work?**
- **Why do you think that this should be included in the school curriculum?**

Who can enter?

- You must be currently educated at a UK state school or 6th form college and be in Year 12 this academic year (or going to be in Year 13 in September 2023) to enter this competition
- You can submit your entry as an individual
- There is no entry fee to enter this competition
- You can submit one entry per year to this competition.

How to enter

You must submit your entries by Monday 24th July 2023.

To submit your entry, you must complete the online entry form available on our website.

As part of completing the entry form, you must provide us with a link to where you have uploaded your video online, for example to YouTube or Vimeo. You can either make the video public or 'unlisted'. It is free to create an account on both of these sites.

The videos should be your own work, and not the work of someone else.

Your video entry must include appropriate credits or references in your video if you use images or content that you do not own the copyright for. This can be a slide at the end of your video.

Video Rights

The video you submit may be used by Pembroke College. This use may include, but is not limited to, sharing on College and University websites and social media channels, publishing on YouTube, re-editing of material to appropriate formats. As far as possible, Pembroke will acknowledge the creation of the original video by the team members in all uses. Please ensure you include appropriate credits or references in your video if you use images etc. that you do not own the

copyright for. By submitting your videos, you agree to be bound by these conditions. You may ask for your video to be removed at any time by emailing admissions@pmb.ox.ac.uk.
