### Further Particulars

Role	<p>College Lecturer in Spanish teaching at the following colleges:</p> <p><i>Pembroke College, St Hilda's College, New College, and University College</i></p> <p>Language teaching is done in small classes (around 4-6) and literature in single or paired tutorials.</p>
Lead tutor	Dr Tim Farrant, Pembroke College
Period of appointment	From 1 October 2026, initially for a twelve-month period (with the possibility of renewal)
Duties	<p>Twelve-hour stint per week for the colleges or the benefit of the colleges, inclusive of time spent on administration:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Spanish language and literature teaching for first-year students: six contact hours per week, unseen classes, literature tutorials and a literature reading group<sup>1</sup>. The post-holder will also set vacation work and college exams.</li> <li>• Literature teaching for second- and fourth-year students with a speciality in the Spanish Golden Age (five contact hours per week)</li> </ul> <p>You will be involved in the teaching, academic administration and pastoral care of students under the direction of the Modern Languages Fellows and/or senior tutors in the student's other subject (English, European and Middle Eastern Languages, History, Linguistics, and Philosophy) in the case of students doing Joint Schools.</p> <p>The Lecturer's Duties will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Organising and delivering the teaching for eleven contact hours per week, averaged out across three terms of eight weeks in the year.</li> <li>• Acting as Organising Tutor for Spanish across the four colleges.</li> <li>• Setting and marking internal College exams (Collections) to a deadline in second week of term.</li> <li>• Writing end of term reports on the performance of your undergraduates using the web-based TMS system.</li> <li>• Liaising as required with other Fellows and Lecturers in the subject and relevant Joint Schools, as regards the teaching of your undergraduates, and in confidence with other relevant College staff about addressing any pastoral problems which may arise amongst your students.</li> <li>• Participating in termly student review meetings and attending the Master's Academic Review for undergraduates in your subject.</li> <li>• Participating in the annual undergraduate admissions exercise.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Taking part in College open days and other Access and Outreach activities introducing potential students to Modern Languages.</li> <li>• Attending College events for undergraduates and graduates and entertaining the students in your subject as organised within that subject.</li> <li>• You will also be required to be actively engaged in research and to agree and participate in a career development plan with the support of the college.</li> </ul>
Salary	The salary will be in the range of £33,810- £37,338 per annum depending on experience and qualifications. The salary figures are 2025-26 rates and are subject to an annual uplift.
