Purpose of Trip: To Explore Opportunities in the Sub-Saharan African Aviation Industry



The Award

In Trinity term of the 2017-2018 academic year, I was awarded the Pier Giorgio Frassati Travel Prize to subsidize with the expenses that I would incur in an exploratory trip to Nigeria. The purpose of the trip was to learn about the state of the aviation industry in Sub-Saharan African and determine if there are in fact opportunities for innovative individuals and organizations. The main objective was assess the feasibility of developing a new airline in Nigeria.

The Journey

For this trip I flew from London to Casablanca, Morocco to Lagos Nigeria on airline called Royal Air Maroc. I visited the local airports and had enlightening conversations with representatives from several airlines and national agencies about the state of affairs in the economy and more specifically the aviation industry.

I didn't learn what I expected to from my trip to Nigeria, but I did learn a lot. It became clear that there are a lot of opportunities for value creation in the Sub-Saharan African aviation industry. Even amongst some newly developed and developing airlines, there didn't seem to be a lot of people or organizations effectively creating value.
