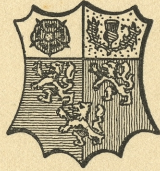

 Before the rising sun.

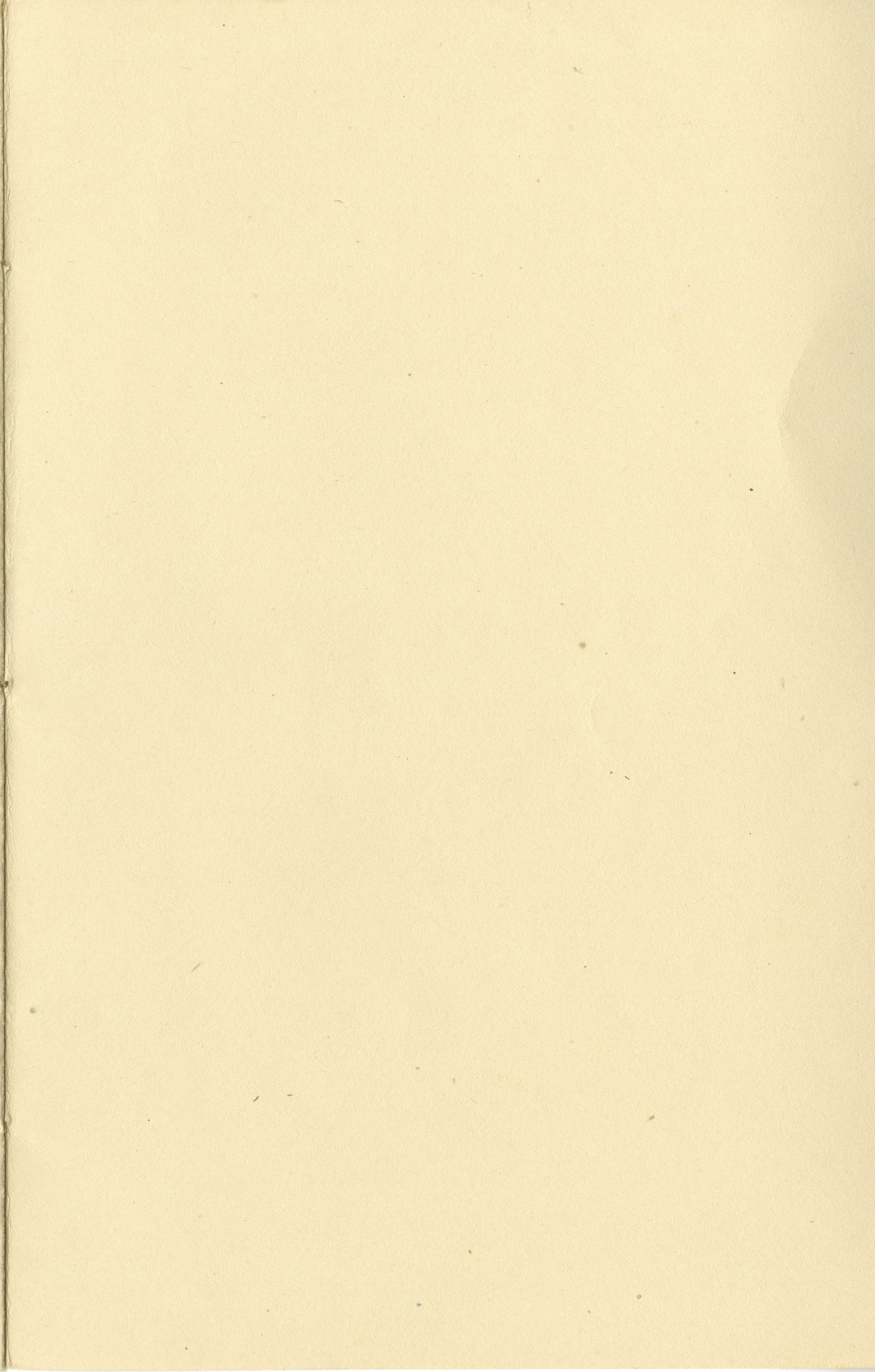
Time, like an ever-rolling stream,

 Dies at the opening day.

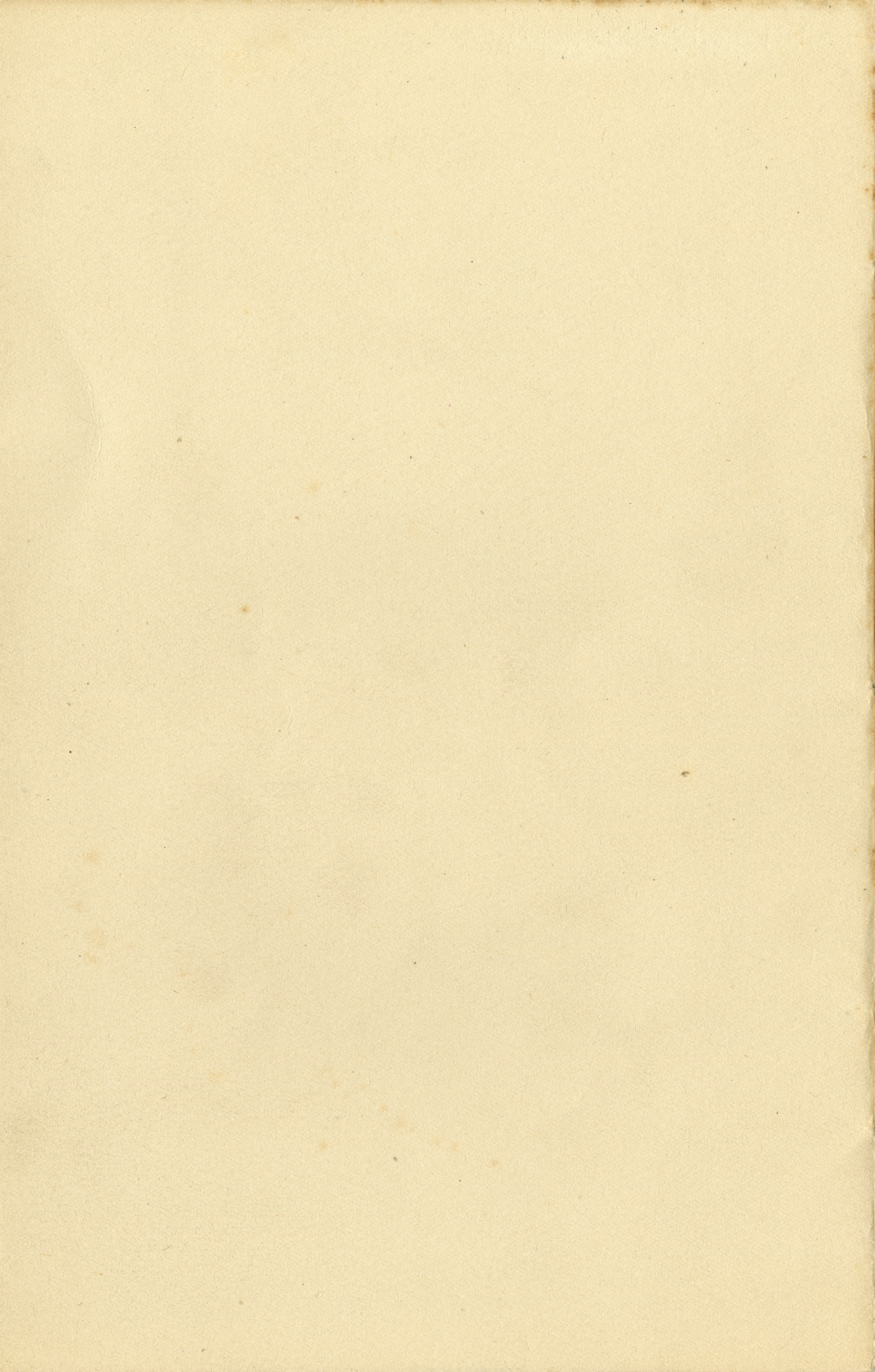
O God, our help in ages past,
